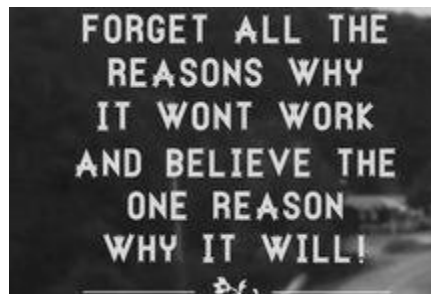

Carol: *We are now gathered together around this table. It is a table that is open and includes all people.*

Nicole: *Here we celebrate God's presence among us united in spirit. We come as God's people broken and whole all at once.*

ALL: **We make one circle of knowing, believing, rejoicing, being, experiencing and sharing God's presence.**

Nicole: This is the great mystery of Christianity that the simple elements of bread and wine are changed not by our words but by what we believe. In other words, the transformation does not happen by supernatural means, it happens when we take these basic foods and we believe that they become the body and life of the Christ forming a new relationship between ourselves and the Divine.

One: We are told that Jesus shared a meal with his friends the night before he was put to death. They came together, they talked and they laughed. They ate and drank. During the meal Jesus took some bread, blessed it and tore it into pieces telling his friends, "This broken bread is my body which will be given for you and for all." and they shared the bread amongst them.

Then Jesus took a cup of wine and he shared it with his companions saying, "Take this cup and pass it one to the other for this is the cup of my life which will be poured out for you and all. For this evening on whenever you come together and break bread and share the wine think of me and remember the great love between you and I.
